

VinciWorks courses mapped to SRA competence statement

The [SRA competence statement](#) describes the competencies that the Solicitors Regulation Authority (SRA) expects solicitors to exhibit. It underpins the new SRA approach to continuing competence.

Solicitors should review the competence statement to identify gaps in their professional competencies and undertake learning to bridge those gaps.

Many of VinciWorks' courses correspond to competencies in the statement. That correspondence is mapped out in the chart on the next page.

The competence statement is divided into four top-level categories and many sub and sub-sub categories.

The top categories are:

- A. Ethics, professionalism and judgement
- B. Technical legal practice
- C. Working with other people
- D. Managing themselves and their own work

The letters and number on the following page map directly to the categories and sub-categories in the competence statement.
