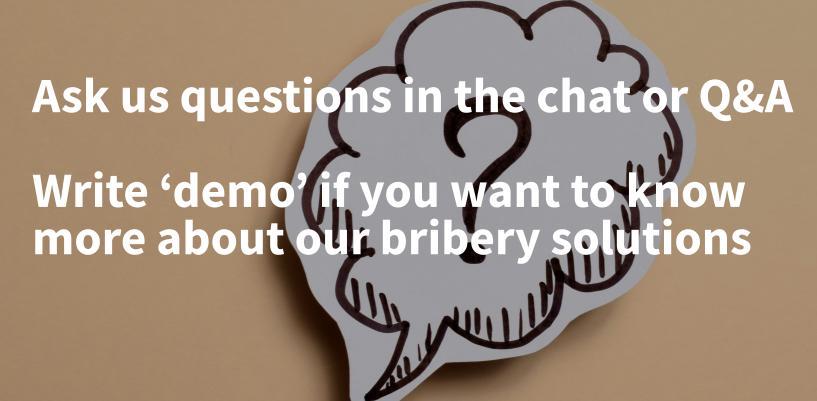

Local government public officials

- Pandemic of corruption at local government level
- 1 in 10 local authorities in England subject to bribery investigation in the last year
- 36 local governments (out of 317) investigated for economic crime
- Dozens arrested and convicted



Local gov corruption not isolated crime

- Liverpool City Council underwent huge corruption scandal in last few years
- In 2019, senior Council officer and property developer arrested for bribery
- Property developer secured real estate on "improperly preferential basis"
- High Court quashed the arrests after police "mistakes"

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Liverpool corruption scandal

- In 2020, council official re-arrested for bribery
- Joe Anderson, Mayor of Liverpool, arrested for bribery and witness intimidation
- City budget shortfall of millions
- Westminster took over the council
- Many planning officials were sacked
- Developers said they had lost trust with Liverpool and the planning officials

The bribery risks of local government

- Local government is a risky space for bribery and corruption
- Less oversight from local press
- Massive push to outsource public functions to private companies
- Less accountability for decision making
- Less scrutiny of accounts or FOI requests
- Some local officials try to sell their influence

Bribery of local officials

- Local councillor in England selling his influence to get planning permission
- Bid rigging between local government contracts
- IBM and Somerset City Council had a joint venture
- £500m deal kept losing the council money
- Iain Liddell-Grainger MP raised issues in parliament
- He said the only reason the contract was signed was that "palms were being greased"



Red flags of bribery and corruption VinĉiWorks

What to consider when training?

- Staff must be able to identify the red flags
- Could include gift giving, favours, nepotism, favouritism
- Is doing the 'right thing' to help a friend wrong?
- Spending small amounts to 'grease the wheels' can seem like an easy decision
- But these small acts can amount to bribery



The rules of gifts and hospitality

- Staff should never accept more than modest gifts, meals and entertainment, and always with a policy
- Corporate spend on G&H must be authorised
- All G&H must be declared and recorded correctly
- Luxury travel, frequent travel, cash gifts or expensive gifts not allowed
- No minimum threshold for corrupt payments



Managing G&H internally

- Need an up-to-date G&H policy
- Policy should cover complex situations
- Need to decide on different levels and thresholds of gifts for job roles
- Assessing gifts from contractors, suppliers, clients and other third parties
- All information should be recorded







Corruption Perception Index (CPI)

- Produced annually by Transparency International
- Consider the CPI when undertaking risk assessments
- CPI ranks countries 0-100, most to least corrupt
- 80% global population live in a corrupt country
- Denmark tops the list with 90
- Finland, Norway, Sweden, New Zealand, Switzerland, Germany, The Netherlands and Singapore least corrupt

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Most corrupt countries

- Conflict zones, unfree countries and weak governments most corrupt
- Yemen, Somalia, Venezuela, Syria, South Sudan,
 Nicaragua, North Korea, Haiti, Equatorial Guinea,
 Turkmenistan, Libya score very low
- Key global supply chain countries also score low
- Myanmar, Cambodia, Bangladesh, Mexico, Sri Lanka, Philippines, Thailand, Turkey

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More countries becoming more corrupt

- 34 countries have declined in their CPI ranking
- 28 countries have improved their CPI ranking
- The United Kingdom, Sweden and Ukraine have all fallen
- Turkey has dropped the most
- 11 points since 2014, and is grey-listed by FATF



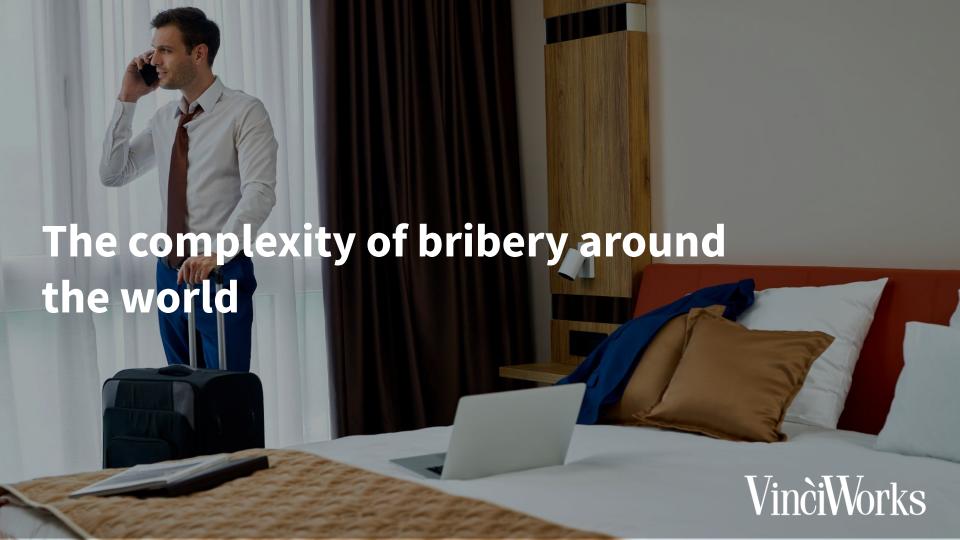
Examining sources for risk assessments

- Case of Bulgaria's 'surprise' addition to FATF grey list
- Joins Croatia as other EU grey listed country
- Bulgaria rocked by financial scandals, sanctions against senior politicians, crypto scams from the country
- Credit Suisse found guilty in a Bulgarian money laundering scam
- Bulgaria had severe warning signs before grey listing VinciWorks

Other countries to consider

- Poland has a low CPI score of 54
- Previous gov undermined judiciary, reduced checks on gov power and rule of law
- A reformist gov elected in 2023, could improve Poland's rankings and perception
- North Macedonia working to undermine rule of law
- Criminal code amended to reduce sanctions on corrupt officials
- 200 cases of public corruption at risk

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Bribery in Argentina

- In Argentina, anti-bribery compliance programme can be used as a defence if a public official is bribed
- Compliance programme must include:
 - code of ethics & risk analysis
 - rules for interacting with public officials
 - staff training & third party due diligence
 - whistleblower protections
 - nominated compliance officer

Bribery in Australia

- Federal and state laws which change often
- Six states and two territories have their own laws
- "Facilitation payments" can be used a defence only if of minor value and for expediting routine gov action
- In the UK, facilitation payments are not allowed
- A British company pleading this defence in Australia could be prosecuted under the UK Bribery Act



Bribery in China

- Some government officials have been executed for bribery
- No single bribery law, but many criminal statutes
- Laws covers public entities, public officials and commercial bribery
- Chinese companies and foreign companies in China covered
- Chinese nationals overseas could also be covered incitions.

Bribery in United Arab Emirates

- Corporate hospitality in Dubai can amount to bribery
- Hospitality given with intent to corrupt can be unlawful
- But any briber who self reports can be exempt from penalties
- UAE had first case of UK Bribery Act failure to prevent
- Putting in place procedures helps to mitigate the risks

Mitigating international bribery risks

- Check critical countries across the value chain
- Suppliers, clients, partners, agents, any third parties
- Investigate and understand risk factors and document risks
- Automated system can help instead of sending out hundreds of emails, collect data into the one place and a central hub of bribery information

Preventing risk of bribery

- Clauses in supplier contracts
- More scrutiny of accounting practices
- Lower threshold for gifts
- Have a tool to evidence transparency
- Failing to have these adequate procedures can be an offence for UK companies
- Not using an automated system is a significant risk
- Improve your G&H data collection to mitigate risk

Cardiff City Council bribery

- Waste disposal contract lost Cardiff £500,000
- Four men sentenced 1-2 years for paying bribes to council staff who operated the large weigh scales
- CPS investigated and found the company bribed the council staff to save money on fees
- £175,000 in bribes paid to 4 staff to save £240,000 in fees

Fort Lee bribery

- Couple from Virginia and Missouri man sentenced to 1.5-2.5 years in prison
- Paid \$92,000 in bribes for \$900,000 in corruptly marked up purchases
- Skookum Educational Services contracted with the US gov to provide services to Fort Lee army base
- All three convicted of conspiring to bribe a public official

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Coca-Cola supplier bribery

- Senior manager at Coca-Cola gave out fake contracts to suppliers, supplied information about rivals' bids
- Received cash bribes, free tickets to football matches, sponsorship of local football team
- Senior manager made around £2m in bribes
- Three companies convicted of failure to prevent bribery and fined
- First case brought by Met Police, not SFO

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Taking G&H seriously

- Set the tone from the top
- Coherent G&H policy supported by senior managers
- All employees to read, understand and comply with policies
- Evidence that compliance
- Train everyone no less than once a year
- People should know how to report a problem

EU's action on bribery

- May 2023, European Commission presented new proposal to combat corruption
- Extend definitions of criminality
- Includes misappropriation, trading influence, abuse of functions, obstruction of justice and illicit enrichment
- Minimum criminal penalties for Member States to introduce

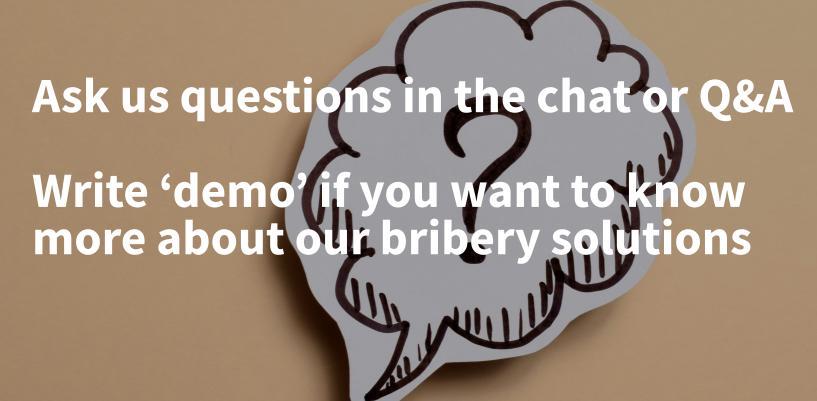
Proposed EU bribery directive

- Formal definition of bribery in private sector
- Legal entities should be held liable for bribery crimes
- Gifts registers should be tracking who is sent gifts, as well as received
- Using Excel is not an option cannot do much
- Need to have different thresholds for job roles, cross-reference with expenses
- Strong audit trail, features to spot red flags

Impact on business

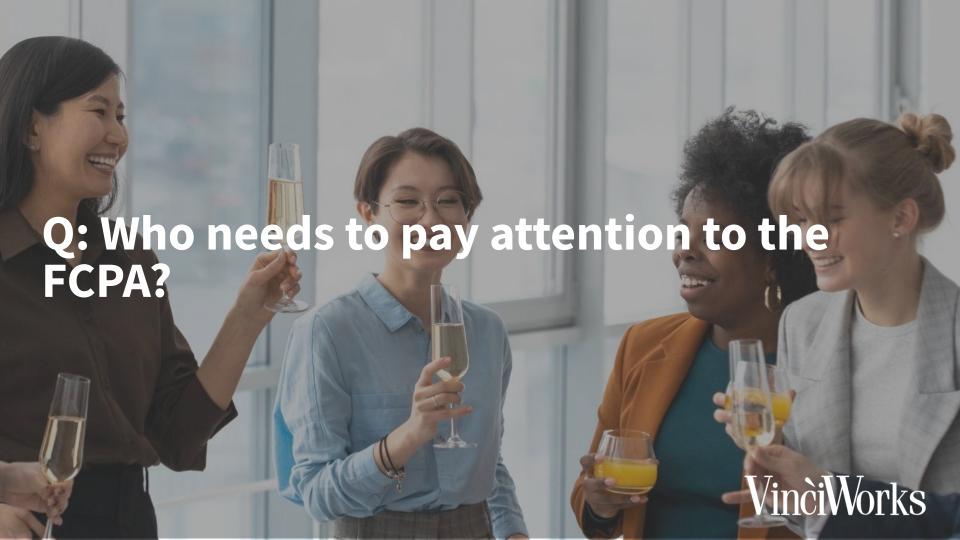
- Broad definition of public official
- EU officials and also Member State officials, third countries, international organisations and courts
- Businesses could be liable for the offences
- Penalties can include prison
- Entities could face 5% worldwide turnover fines
- Disqualification or debarment from conducting business

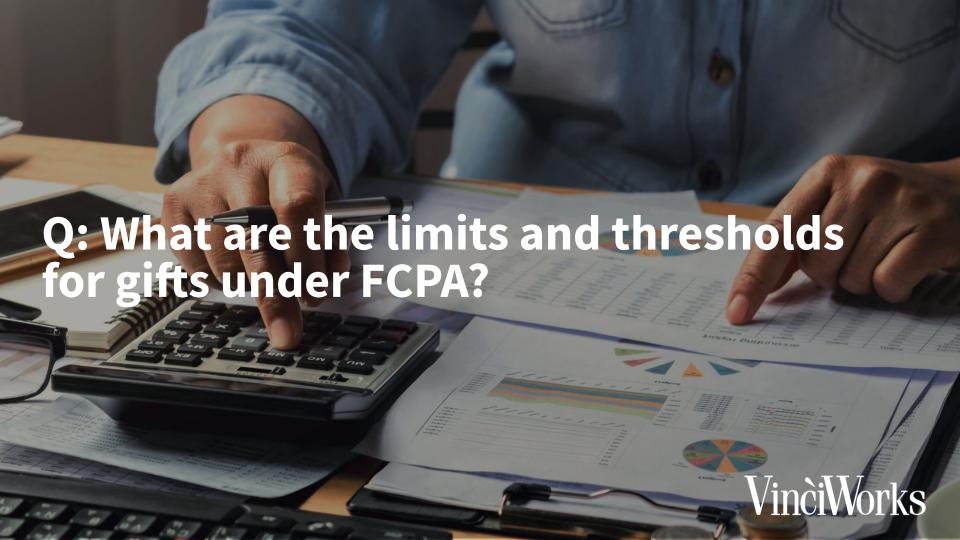
